Curriculum Overview for Year 6 Summer 2

These English units will be linked to the topic 'Oh! I do . like to be beside the seaside'

Speaking, listening and dramatic conventions

English

Recount: Autobiography

- An autobiography, written in role as a Listen to, read and discuss an character:
 - A fictional person linked with the seaside, e.g. pier show performer, Punch and Judy puppeteer, fairground ride inventor, ice-cream salesman, owner of a donkey ride company.

A character from the class novel.

Grammar, Punctuation & Spelling will be taught on a daily basis

Poems on a Theme

- increasingly wide range of poetry.

- Recognise themes within and across texts e.g. leisure, threat, time, natur

Clip n' Climb & Blackpool **Pleasure Beach**

Children will write a persuasive leaflet about their challenges at Clip n' Climb and a recount about their trip to Blackpool Pleasure Beach.

Mathematics

- World Cup 2018 statistics and problem solving questions using mean, median, mode and range.

Computing

• Children will use the Purple Mash software to to programme their own game based around this terms theme 'Oh! I do like to be beside seaside'.

Geography

Mrs. McLean will teach the subject and children will aim to achieve the John Muir Trust Award. This is an environmental award scheme focused on wild places. Through a number of exciting activities the children will develop their appreciation and awareness of urban green spaces and wild landscapes.
