Dear Parents & Guardians,

Welcome back after the Easter break. We have many events and activities planned for the summer term including the King's Coronation celebrations, our annual sports day and further curriculum enrichment activities including the launch of Forest School.

Worship Value—Friendship and celebrating Pentecost

This half term our worship value is friendship. Children will learn what it means to be a good friend, someone who can be trusted and is loyal. During today's worship, a small group of pupils in Year 3 plaited a large friendship bracelet. This symbolizes how the three pieces plaited together makes it stronger and takes time and effort, just like building a good friendship. We will celebrate the season of Pentecost at the end of May which is 50 days after Easter and marks the time when the first disciples received the gift of the Holy Spirit. Children will explore the meaning of Pentecost through RE lessons and class worship. We will award acts of friendship during whole-school worship every Monday and Father Matthew will continue to lead worship to the whole school every Thursday morning. He accompanies this collective time together by playing the piano, guitar or violin.

Forest School

Today sees the launch of our Forest School curriculum and Year 2 have enjoyed an afternoon outdoors. Year 3 will start their sessions tomorrow with the official launch in September. The site has been transformed with a selection of native trees planted, a hedge to mark the site and 2 purpose built sheds. Thank you to Michael at Newgate Nurseries for supplying a mix of native trees, the team at J A Jones for donating all the hazel trees and for Mr Wilding and his team from All Seasons Gardening for constructing the shelter and sheds.
